On 6 July 2023, Minister Grace announced mobile phones and certain wearable devices, such as smartwatches, will need to be 'Away for the day' from Term 1, 2024.				
The new <i>Student use of mobile devices</i> procedure outlines the requirements for all Queensland state school to follow to enact this requirement, including responsibilities of principals, state school staff, students and their parents/carers.				
2. Summary of changes				
The <i>Student use of mobile devices</i> procedure requires Queensland state schools to follow processes for developing, consulting, documenting, communicating, implementing and reviewing their local policy approach to student use of mobile devices.				
The procedure outlines:				
 the requirement for all Queensland state school students to keep their mobile phones switched off and 'away for the day' and/or disable notifications on wearable devices during school hours 				
 the requirement for the principal (or their delegate) to develop a local policy approach, (including optional components for determination) in consultation with their school community 				
 the requirement for the principals (or their delegate) to include a process for seeking exemptions for students who require the use of their mobile device due to medical, disability and/or wellbeing reasons 				
• the requirement for the principal (or their delegate) to document their local policy approach in the school's <i>Student Code of Conduct</i> and communicate their approach to staff, students, parents and carers				
• the requirement for schools to implement and review their local policy approach in line with the <i>Student Code of Conduct</i> review process.
