The Working with children (blue card) procedure, and supporting materials, have been updated to comply with the changes to the Working with Children (Risk Management and Screening) Act 2000 (WWC Act), commencing on 1 July and 20 September 2025.					
2. Summary of changes					

A summary of key changes is outlined below:

## Register

From 1 July 2025, Registers need to include extra details, including all workers' dates of birth. Further, if the worker works with children and does not require a card, the reason why (such as having a professional registration exemption or restricted employment exemption) must be included in the Register. A Register template has been provided by Blue Card Services to comply with the new requirements.

#### Parent volunteers

From 20 September 2025, there are new rules for when parent volunteers require, and do not require, a blue card. Specifically, parent volunteers will not require a blue card if the service or activity is provided to their own child. However, parent volunteers will now require a blue card if:

- the services or activities provided to children are not provided to their own child; or
- they attend overnight excursions or camps; or
- they may have close personal contact (such as assisting with toileting/nappy changing, bathing or dressing) with a child other than their own.

Employees (other than teachers) and volunteers working in schools

Workers (paid or unpaid) will need a blue card if they carry out work within a school area accessible to children during operational hours, including administration staff, cleaners and groundskeepers. If the work is not directed towards children and the nature of the work does not facilitate more than incidental contact with children, the worker will not need a blue card (e.g. tradespeople).

#### Businesses operating at schools

Business operators who offer services or activities in schools where children are present, or at times when children are usually there, will need a blue card and must comply with any applicable blue card requirements for organisations. Schools are not responsible for ensuring the business operators have blue cards or managing their blue card requirements. Those obligations fall onto those business operators. However, the procedure requires that blue cards are validated upon entry to the departmental premises.
