Approved teacher	A person who holds full registration, provisional registration or a permission to teach under the <u>Education (Queensland College of Teachers) Act 2005</u> , as defined in <u>Schedule 7</u> of the WWC Act
Blue card	A working with children card, as outlined in Schedule 7 of the WWC Act, that evidence that a working with children authority has been issued to a person by Blue Card Services
Business operator	A sole/self-employed/business operator providing a <u>regulated child-related service or activity</u> , as outlined in <u>Schedule 1, Part 2</u> of the <i>Working with Children (Risk Management and Screening) Act 2000</i> (WWC Act)
Card	The collective term used in this Guide to refer to both a blue card and an exemption card issued by Blue Card Services
Carer	In relation to a stand-alone service, means a person- (a) who is engaged to provide education and care of a child in the course of a stand-alone service; or (b) who is conducting the stand-alone service and providing education and care of children in the course of the service, as defined in Schedule 7 of the WWC Act
Child accommodation service	A service for which the main purpose is to provide accommodation for children but does not include the care of children by an approved carer under the <u>Child Protection Act 1999</u> acting in that capacity, or the provision of accommodation to children under residential tenancy agreements under the <u>Residential Tenancies and Rooming Accommodation Act 2008</u> , as defined in <u>Schedule 7</u> of the WWC Act
Child-related duty	A relevant duty to be performed in the department as determined by the chief executive, or delegate, under the <u>Directive</u>
Child-related work	Refers to regulated employment, restricted employment, working with children under a professional registration exemption and a child-related duty. (See the Working with children (blue card) procedure for further information)
Close personal contact	For example, assisting a child with toileting / nappy changing, bathing or dressing
Detention centre	A detention centre established under <u>section 262</u> of the <i>Youth Justice Act 1992,</i> as outlined in <u>Schedule 1, Part 1, section 4B</u> of the WWC Act. (Examples may include education units within youth detention centres, such as Brisbane Youth Education and Training Centre, Cleveland Education and Training Centre and West Morton Education and Training Centre)
Disqualified person	 A person who is: Convicted of a disqualifying offence—regardless of the penalty and regardless of when and where it occurred; A reportable offender outlined in <u>section 5</u> of the Child Protection (Offender Reporting and Offender Prohibition Order) Act 2004 (CP Act); The subject of an offender prohibition order under the CP Act; Prohibited by a court from applying for or holding a blue card; or The subject of a sexual offender order under the <u>Dangerous Prisoners (Sexual Offenders) Act 2003</u>
Disqualifying offence	An offence listed in <u>Schedule 4</u> or <u>Schedule 5</u> of the WWC Act

ECS	An Education and Care Service as defined under <u>section 5(1)</u> of the <i>Education and Care Services National Law (Queensland)</i> (ECS National Law) or <u>section 8</u> of the Queensland education and care service under the <i>Education and Care Services Act 2013</i> (ECS Act). Examples include, an OSHC service providing vacation, before and/or after school care or a <u>State Delivered Kindergarten</u>
ECS premises	Means each place an Education and Care Service, other than a family day care service, operates (or is going to operate) as defined under section 5(1) of the ECS National Law or for a Queensland education and care service (QEC) each place at which a QEC service operates or is to operate, as defined under Schedule 1 of the ECS Act
Educator	An individual who provides education and care for children as part of an education and care service or QEC, as defined in Schedule 7 of the WWC Act
Executive Committee	means a group or body of people, by whatever name called, that manages the affairs of the church, club or association relating to children, as defined in Schedule 1 , Part 1 , Section 5 of the WWC Act
Executive Officer	Of a corporation, means any person, by whatever name called and whether or not the person is a director of the corporation, who is concerned or takes part in the management of the corporation, as defined in Schedule 7 of the WWC Act
Exemption card	A working with children card, as outlined in <u>Schedule 7</u> of the WWC Act, specifically for Queensland registered teachers working outside of schools and school boarding facilities
NDIS	National Disability Insurance Scheme
Negative notice	Blue Card Services' decision that the person cannot hold a card
OSHC	An Outside School Hours Care service providing vacation, before and/or after school care
Other worker	A person who, by written or unwritten agreement, carries out work, paid or unpaid, as listed in section 10 of the WWC Act
Parent	Is the child's mother, father or someone else having or exercising parental responsibility for the child - see section 390 of the WWC Act for a full definition
QCT	Queensland College of Teachers
Register	In accordance with section 369 of the WWC Act, a written record of each employee in regulated employment who: • has made a working with children check application; • holds a working with children authority; • is employed in restricted employment; and • is not required to apply for a working with children authority
Registered health practitioner	Means a person registered under the <u>Health Practitioner Regulation National Law</u> , other than as a student
Registered teacher	A person who holds full registration or provisional registration under the Education (Queensland College of Teachers) Act 2005 and whose full or provisional registration is not suspended under section 48 or 49 of that Act

Regulated employment	Has the meaning outlined in <u>\$156</u> of the WWC Act. There are <u>various categories of employment</u> under the Act, such as <u>Schools</u> , <u>School boarding facilities</u> , <u>Education and care services</u> , <u>Child accommodation services</u> , <u>Residential facilities</u> and <u>Justice and detention services</u> . Under <u>Schedule 1, Part 1</u> of the WWC Act, the employment of approved teachers in Schools and School boarding facilities is not considered regulated employment
Restricted employment	 The situations or exemptions that allow a person to work in regulated employment* without a blue card, such as if they are: a volunteer parent where the service or activity provided to children is also provided to the parent's own child (except for other specified circumstances that require a card - refer to this Quick Reference Guide above for further information) a volunteer who is under 18 years old paid or unpaid staff who work in regulated child-related employment for not more than 7 days in a calendar year (unless a card is require prior to commencement as outlined in this Quick Reference Guide above) a person with disability who is employed at a place where the person also receives disability services or NDIS supports or services a secondary school student on work experience who carries out disability related work under the direct supervision of a person who holds a blue or exemption card
Restricted person	A restricted person is a person who either: has been issued a negative notice has a suspended blue card is a disqualified person has been charged with a disqualifying offence that has not been finalised, or is the subject of an adverse interstate Working with Children Check decision that is in effect
School	Means a State educational institution, specifically a State primary, secondary or special education school, environmental education centre and outdoor education centre, or student hostels or student residential colleges, under sections 13, 14 or 15 of the Education (General Provisions) Act 2006
School boarding facilities	A boarding facility at a school covered under <u>Schedule 1, Part 1, section 2</u> of the WWC Act. (Examples may include State school boarding facilities at <u>Spinifex State College</u> (Mount Isa), <u>Western Cape College</u> (Weipa) and <u>Dalby State High School</u>)
Staff member	 Education and care service - An individual employed, appointed or engaged to work in or as part of the education and care service. Includes the nominated supervisor and a person employed, appointed or engaged as a volunteer QEC approved service - any individual (other than a volunteer) employed, appointed or engaged to work in or as part of the service, whether as an educator or otherwise Stand-alone service - a person engaged in a position in the service, or a person conducting the service and carrying out the functions of a position in the service
Stand-alone service	Means a stand-alone service under section 9 of the Education and Care Services Act 2013
Volunteer	A person providing a service or activity to children on a voluntary basis (i.e. not for a financial reward). Examples include parent volunteers or other volunteers
Working with children authority	A blue card or exemption card issued by Blue Card Services
WWC Act	Working with Children (Risk Management and Screening) Act 2000
