INSTRUMENT OF DELEGATION AND AUTHORISATION

Constitution of Queensland 2001

I, the Honourable John-Paul Langbroek MP, Minister for Education and the Arts under section 55(1) of the *Constitution of Queensland 2001*, DELEGATE those powers and functions conferred or imposed on me under the provisions of the *Constitution of Queensland 2001*, which are specified in Column 1 of Schedule 1, subject to the limitations (if any) specified in Column 3 of Schedule 1, to the persons who are from time to time the holders of each position specified in Column 4 of Schedule 1.

This Instrument is comprised of this page, and Schedule 1 comprising 2 pages. No other material forms part of the Instrument.

This Instrument revokes and replaces the Instrument of Delegation and Authorisation issued by the Minister for Education, Minister for Industrial Relations and Minister for Racing on 22 December 2022 in relation to particular activities of the parts of the Department of Education known as Education Queensland International and Department of Education International. However, this Instrument does not limit any other Instrument of Delegation previously issued with respect to the powers and functions of the Minister mentioned in this Instrument under the *Constitution of Queensland 2001*.

The Delegate is authorised to sign one or more contracts on behalf of the State of Queensland for the supply of the goods and or services up to the total value of the supply (inclusive of taxes) as set out in the row below adjacent to the Delegate's title in Column 4. The Delegate must ensure the supply of the goods and or services are not split into separate transactions to remain within the total value of his or her delegation. The Delegate in exercising this power must consider all relevant: (i) laws; (ii) legislation; (iii) Queensland government and Department of Education policies. No Subdelegation Although s.55(2) of the Constitution of Queensland 2001 allows an officer of the State to subdelegate the delegated power to another appropriately qualified officer of the State, the Delegates in this Instrument must not subdelegate the power delegated to them under this Instrument.

Authorised Signatories

The following are authorised to sign one or more contracts on behalf of the State of Queensland for the supply of the goods and or services where prior written approval is given by any of the above listed Delegates up to the total value of the supply (inclusive of taxes) as set out in this column above:

- Executive Director, DE International (trading as Education Queensland International),
 Department of Education;
- Director International Business, DE International (trading as Education Queensland International), Department of Education;
- Director Global Engagement, DE International (trading as Education Queensland International), Department of Education; and
- Director International Student Programs, DE International (trading as Education Queensland International), Department of Education.

The prior written approval from the Delegate to the authorised signatory must contain (a) the Delegate's approval to the terms and conditions of the particular contract in question and (b) expressly authorise the authorised signatory to sign the particular contract in question.

No Subdelegation

Although s.55(2) of the *Constitution of Queensland 2001* allows an officer of the State to subdelegate the delegated power to another appropriately qualified officer of the State, the Delegates in this Instrument must not subdelegate the power delegated to them under this Instrument.
